

Call for applications for performance scholarships for the academic year 2023/24 according to §§ 57-61 Study Support Act 1992 (StudFG)

Merit scholarships serve to recognise outstanding academic achievements within the framework of a regular degree programme.

A merit scholarship may not be less than 750 euros and not exceed 1,500 euros.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS:

Citizenship of an EEA member state or equal status for nationals (according to §4 StudFG).

You are considered equal to a national if you:

- have a "Daueraufenthaltskarte EU" (EU permanent residence card)
- are Swiss and have been living in Austria for five years without interruption
- are stateless and
 - have been subject to unlimited income tax liability in Austria together with one parent for at least five years prior to your first admission to the SFU and
 - had the centre of their life interests here during this period of time
- Are a refugee
- are a British citizen

Regular student of SFU (at all campuses of Sigmund Freud University)

Compliance with the period of entitlement (§ 18 StudFG), taking into account any important reasons (§ 19 StudFG): The period of entitlement basically comprises the period of study intended for the degree programme plus one additional semester. When calculating the duration of entitlement, the duration of studies in the old study plan is added in the case of a change to a new study plan.

Outstanding academic achievements in the regular fields of study *Psychotherapy Science (PTW), Psychology (PSY), Human/Dental Medicine (MED) and Law (JUS)* of **at least 50 ECTS credits**, which are decisive for the degree programme.

For the total number of ECTS credits achieved in the academic year, also those performances which were assessed "successfully completed (s.c.)" count; however, they are **not** included in the calculation of the grade point average.

The examination date according to the academic year division from **1.9.2023 to 31.8.2024** applies.

- The bachelor's thesis as well as the master's thesis and the respective final examinations are included in the assessment.
- Doctoral studies in psychotherapy science/psychology: The doctoral studies must have been completed in the calculation period; the dissertation must have been assessed with "Very good" and the final examination with "Very good" or "Good".

Grade point average

- For all four fields of study (PTW, PSY, MED and JUS): **1.5**

APPLICATION DEADLINE: Mon, 23 September to Fri, 11 October 2024

APPLICATION PROCESS:

- **Psychotherapy Science: Personal submission** with completed application form and copies of evidence of all relevant confirmations for the **practical parts of the study programme** during the period (PE/MPE, internship, reflection on internship, practice, reflection on practice, teaching analysis, individual or group supervision, methods workshop), at the PTS Study Service Centre - ZI-No. 4015.

The following documents are **not** required

- Transcript of Records
- Evidence for the B4-UU "Window of Opportunity" (as this study plan is only counted if it is also entered in Academy 5)
- Proof of attendance of additional courses (e.g. Gender Study Group...)
- Evidence for literature seminars
- Evidence of research activities

Required proof of nationality equality and any important reasons for extending the period of entitlement must also be enclosed.

Attention: If there is any pandemic at the time of the application deadline, the government regulations then in force based on the Epidemic Act would apply.

ACKNOWLEDGMENT:

All applicants will be notified of the award or rejection by message to the email address. There is no legal entitlement to the award (§ 61 Abs 2 StudFG).

If too many students fulfil the minimum requirements in relation to the funds made available, only those students who can prove the best performance (grade point average lower than 1.5) and have achieved significantly more than 50 ECTS points will be considered for the award. If there are too many eligible students, it is possible that students who already received a scholarship in the last academic year will not be considered in this year's distribution.
